

Meagan Hunt student tenure: December 2012 – April 2017

An accomplished percussionist in many areas, Meagan holds the distinction that very few students in the "Special Alumni" list share: she received I ratings at the State Level for her percussion solos every single year, from freshman to senior- a clean sweep. Her primary interest in percussion was marimba, but she also was a solid leader in the bass drum line of her high school drum line, achieving the position of Captain her senior year. She also had success early on in her percussion development, making John Philip Sousa Honor Band, and participating in The Lawrence Youth Symphony. Her accomplishments include:

It was a joyous occasion and final "icing on the cake" for us both in our student/teacher relationship when she performed that piece at State Contest that year along side LHS accompanist Randall Frye, receiving the Superior Rating.
